Location

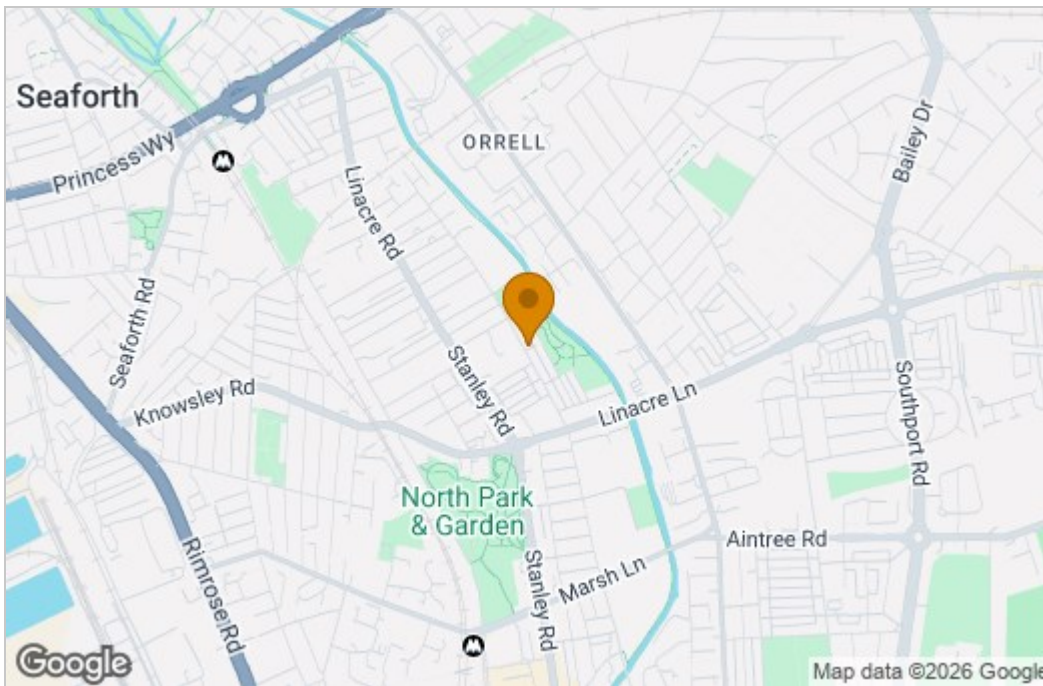

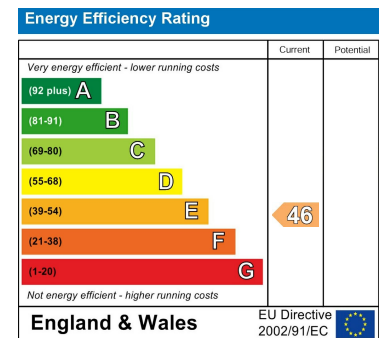
